

Half Day ISPS Code & MSA Awareness Training for Persons with Designated Security Duties incl Maritime Security Guards

ISPS Code & NZ MS Act & Regulations 2004. Syllabus based on the IMO Model Course 3.25 (2011).

This short and interactive course is delivered by Scott McEwan AFNI, an Australian former shipping industry executive and one of Oceania's recognised authorities on the ISPS Code and maritime security management systems implementation.

Aims

To provide essential maritime security awareness knowledge to persons who may be required to maintain the integrity of a port security area, acting under the authority of a Port Facility Security Officer.

Topics covered include:

- Relevant sections of the ISPS Code & of the NZ MS Act & Regulations (2004)
- Responsibilities of governments, ships, ports, facilities – including employees & contractors
- Key roles:
 - Government authorities
 - Ships
 - Port facilities
 - Authorised persons i.e. maritime security, police & customs officers
- Current maritime security threats and vulnerabilities
- Recognition on a non-discriminatory basis of persons potentially posing potential security risks
- Recognition and detection of weapons, prohibited items, dangerous substances and devices
- Maritime security levels 1, 2 & 3 and security measures actions typically applied at different levels
- Restricted Areas – access control measures and monitoring
- Establishing and maintaining a cooperative relationship with a Ship Security Officer
- Port security areas and MS Officers' powers under the MSA Part 3.
- Security evacuation considerations
- Maintaining awareness and vigilance at the ship / port interface
- Communicating critical and sensitive information
- Security incident reporting – obligations and record keeping

Who should attend

This awareness course is for persons who will be required to perform the duties of a Maritime Security Guard under the Maritime Security Act Part 3.

Entry standards

A current licence to work as a security guard in New Zealand is desirable

Locations & size

Courses are delivered at Pelagus's venues or in-house with a minimum of 6 per class. For maximum learning and interactivity, class size is normally limited to 12.
